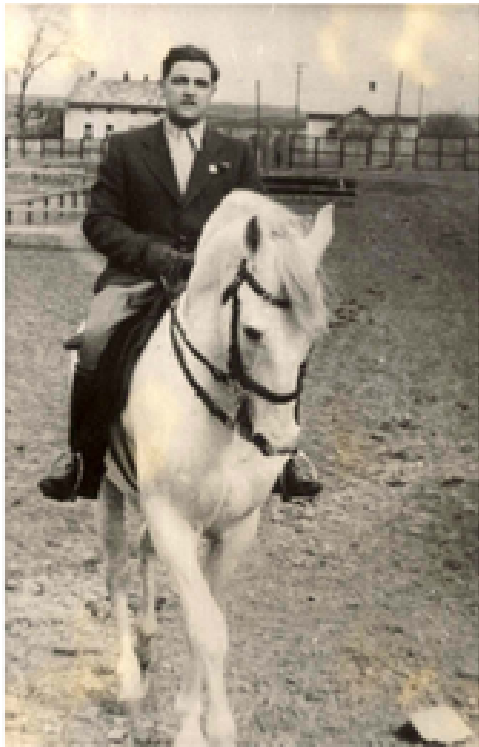


Felix Landau (1910–1983)



Carpenter

1933/34: Joins the SA and then the SS

1934: Participates in the murder of Austrian Chancellor Dollfuß

1937: Criminal Police Office in Berlin

1939: Gestapo Vienna

1940: Security Service (SD) in Radom

1941: Stationed in Drohobycz, responsible for recruiting Jews to forced labor; writing a diary for his fiancée

After 1945: Hides in Swabia under the name of "Rudolf Jaschke"

1962: Life imprisonment (Stuttgart district court)

1973: Pardoned

On 22.7.1941 Felix Landau writes in his diary:

»In the morning the workers I ordered did not turn up. As I was about to go to the Jew's Committee, one of their staff arrived and asked for my support as the Jews refused to work here. I went over there. When these assholes saw me they ran in all directions. Pity I wasn't carrying a pistol or I would have taken down a few. I then went to the Jew's council and told them if 100 Jews did not arrive within the hour I would pick 100 Jews myself, not for work but to shoot them. A mere 30 minutes later 100 Jews arrived, plus an extra 17 to make up for those who had fled. I reported the incident, demanding that those that had fled should be shot as refusing to work, which happened exactly 12 hours later. Twenty Jews were topped.«
