

Israel Zygmunt Lippman (1895-1944)



Profession: Dentist.

Married to Lusja, née Fishman (Fischman). Son Tusio (born 1935)

1941: Continues working as a dentist, also for the German occupying forces.

1942: Forced move to the ghetto

1942/43: Officially he is now employed by the Karpathen-Öl. Barracked in the forced labor camp (ZAL) Borysław, he works during the day

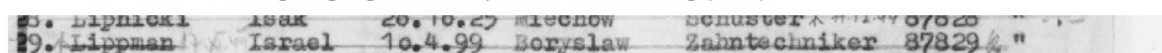
as a winter road clearance worker or dentist. The guards are bribed with money he earns as a dentist. While he works, his wife and son are seized and then murdered

1944: Israel provides for the family of his brother Abraham (Etká, Józef) a paid shelter with a Ukrainian peasant family. He himself does not follow - after the death of his wife and son he has given himself up.

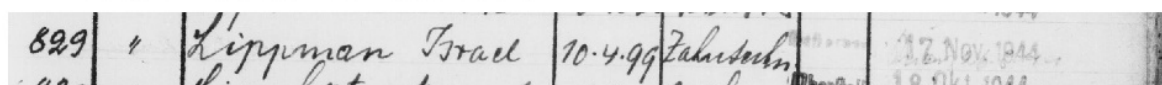
When ZAL Borysław is liquidated, he is transported to the Plaszów concentration camp, from there to the Melk subcamp of Mauthausen concentration camp, where he has to work for Steyr-Daimler-Puch AG in the quarry and after a few weeks dies.



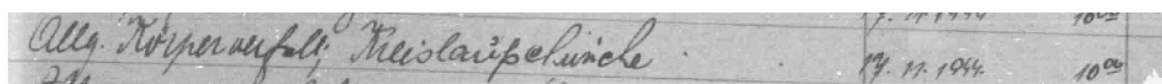
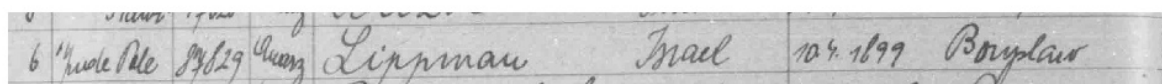
