Günther Kahlenberg (1916-1945)



Plumber, Criminal Investigator, Criminal

Born on 15.11.1916 in Berlin. Apprenticeship as plumber

1936-38: "General Göring" Regiment

1939: in February transferred to the border police in Grünberg (Silesia); from September 1939 deployment in occupied Poland

1941-1944: Security police officer in the Generalgouvernement, longer assignments in Stanislau and Drohobycz: Oberscharführer and criminal assistant at the Drohobycz SiPo field office. Extensive appropriation of looted property from Jews

A driver of the SiPo Drohobycz, Eduard Jurkschat, characterises him thus: Kahlenberg "was a dangerous fellow. I saw that he had been involved in shooting. I was on the road with him a lot and also witnessed his violence." (Interrogation Jurkschat, 14.1.1965, in: LASH Abt. 352.4 Bd. 1734, Bl. 1326)

1945: Operations in Italy

07/1945: Return to Berlin (East); arrests; giving false personal details and places of residence, escape

11/1945: Seriously injured in an armed robbery and died on 17.11.1945 in a hospital in Herne. Death certificate issued in the name of Günter von Platen.

1946: Posthumously his true identity is established

A file of the LG Bochum 4 KLs 51/46 for street robbery against Schellberg et al. shows that

»the former member of the security police of Stanislau and Drohobycz, K a h l e n b e r g , Günter, born 15.11.1916 in Berlin alias

von Platen, Günter, graduate engineer, resident in Wewer near Paderborn ... died on 17 Nov. 1945 in the Sankt-Marien-Hospital in Herne as a result of a bullet in the neck ...« (Note crime commissioner Ponthöfer, Dusseldorf, 30.7.1967)
