On 21.10.1942 - 10.00 a.m. the Aktion was started and continued after the arrival of the platoon from the Breslau Police Guard Battalion until 24.10.42.

The assigned platoon from the Breslau Guard Battalion was marched back to Lemberg on 23.10. in the afternoon at 3.30 pm.

From Drohobycz were resettled	1,179 Jews
from Sambor	460 Jews
from Boryslaw	1,020 Jews
<u>from Stryj</u>	<u>800 Jews</u>
in total	3,459 Jews

The Jews in Drohobycz and Boryslaw fled days before the action, so the Aktion was very difficult and did not bring the expected success. In my opinion, ongoing local actions in which the returning Jews are arrested bring more success. In Stryj and Sambor this procedure has already been followed.
